Key Responsibilities

As the Roots & Shoots State Coordinator in your respective state, you will be a natural people person who loves investing in youth leaders, facilitating community events, building a volunteer team and keeping wider organisational visions in mind. You will have a range of skills & experience to cover key areas of responsibility, including:

- 1. Leading a team of local youth & adult volunteers in your state to facilitate community events that connect children, youth and families with nature
- 2. Lead your team in designing and delivering local Roots & Shoots community events (i.e. Tree Planting Events, Clean-Up Australia Events) in your region
- 3. Liaising with volunteers and partners, and Roots & Shoots Australia members.
- 4. Connecting with local schools, zoos and universities in your region to amplify the message of Dr. Jane Goodall with the support of the R&S Australia team.
- 5. Creating shareable media content and written communications to be shared across the Jane Goodall Institute Australia network during the year
- 6. Communicate with local schools in your region to celebrate their achievements (i.e. attending an Award Ceremony at a local school to present certificates)
- 7. Attending 1x National Leadership Meeting per month with the Roots & Shoots Australia community (Zoom), to share good news, develop networks and build your environmental leadership skills.

- 2. Experience in event design and coordination
- 3. Ability to liaise with a variety of different community stakeholders and partners
- 4. Ability to facilitate & engage a team of volunteers to deliver successful events
- 5. Excellent written and interpersonal skills
- 6. Demonstrated experience working autonomously and as part of a team
- 7. Knowledge of key conservation and environmental issues
- 8. Passionate about promoting sustainability and conservation
- 9. Budget management experience
- 10. The ability to work well remotely, sometimes with interstate team members
- 11. Working with Children Check & National Police Check (or willingness to apply)



Desired Criteria

- 12. Tertiary qualification in Environment, Environmental Science, Education or related fields
- 13. Working knowledge of Jane Goodall's Roots & Shoots Australia
- 14. Experience in engaging with university communities
- 15. Previous experience of coordinating youth engagement events, particularly those related to environment and science

Working at JGIA

JGIA is an equal opportunities employer, and is always actively looking for applicants from a diverse range of genders, cultures, language groups, abilities, and experiences to apply. To be eligible to apply for this position you must have an appropriate Australian or New Zealand work visa or be eligible to apply for one.
